MIDWEEK REFRESHER

Read: Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20

Reflect: In Luke's gospel the mission of the seventytwo disciples takes on a double significance. On the one hand, it demonstrates that the proclamation of the kingdom is not the exclusive task of the Twelve. On the other hand, for the Jews of Jesus' time the number 72 functioned as a symbol for the total number of the Gentile nations. It is not by chance that at various times on his way up to Jerusalem Jesus preached salvation to the Gentiles. The seventy-two disciples confidently set out to conquer the world. We get a glimpse here of the driving force of Christian preaching inspired by the experience of the wind of Pentecost. Paradoxically, the most stable element in Christianity is the command always to go forward. The goal of apostolic ministry consists not in seeking its own success but in preparing people for personal encounter with Christ. The missionaries are but precursors. It is for Christ that they labor. To pray is to call upon the "immeasurable scope of his power in us who believe" (Ep. 1: 19)

Pray: Prepare me, O Lord, for the task of easing your entry into the lives of others.

<u>Act:</u> Identify the people with whom you associate to whom you could introduce Christ.
