READ: Matthew 22: 34-40

REFLECT: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy" (Lv. 19: 2). The people of God must take God as their model. He is loving and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in mercy. In his fidelity, he cares for those who cannot help themselves. The widow, the alien, the orphan are under his special protection. The people bound to him by covenant must also show their fidelity by caring for the powerless. All the detailed laws of the covenant lead back to this basic principle: the sole demand of God is love. Jesus says that the second commandment is like the first. In fact it is the manifestation of the first. If you love the lord y our God with your whole being, that love will show itself in the feeding of the hungry, the sheltering of the homeless, the release of the oppressed. Jesus, the supreme revelation of the Father's love, showed the depth of that love by giving his life for us when we were still powerless. The sign that we are his disciples is our love for one another.

PRAY: Praying to God involves loving your neighbor, even those you do not like.

ACT: Be courteous and polite to all in an effort to love.

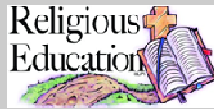
